Fire exits maintained. Sunflower fire exit must be bolted from inside, not locked with a key. Teachers responsible for ensuring candles/incense are safe and extinguished before leaving the building. Burns	All teachers/facilitators and clients	Burned hands	Radiators (gas) and associated pipes are not so hot as to cause burns by touching for a short time. Teachers/facilitators to be aware of students if asking them to put hands/feet near pipes or radiators and instruct accordingly. Plug-in electric heaters are used occasionally – teachers are responsible for alerting to this hazard, especially if teaching children.	X	SLIGHT

Water temperature in kitchen sink is hot but a warning sign is placed there and new mixer tap installed. Burns blanket & ice packs in first aid kit.
